
From September the classes will have the following teachers and TAs:

Parking!

A number of the local residents have had trouble parking and turning their cars around recently due to people parking in the resident area directly outside the school gate. Not only has this



been frustrating for them, but some have medical needs and need to park directly in front of their homes and have been unable to.

Please can we remind you that the road from the Bostal up to the field is for residents only parking and the entrance to this road should not be used as a turning point for cars. This is posing a health and safety risk and the police have been notified by some of the residents.

In addition one of our neighbours with a house on the Bostal has reported one or some of our parents parking on their drive, as well as an incident on Monday 10^{th} July when they found their wing mirror had been damaged following the drop off time at the start of the school day. Apparently two cars were attempting to pass each other and one had to mount the corner of the resident's drive - hitting the wing mirror. If you have any information about this incident we would be grateful if you could let us know.

We would urge our parents to remember driveways are private property and that if you accidentally damage a car you should inform the owner or leave a note etc.

Firle is a village school and as such an integral part of the village community - we would really appreciate it if you could help us maintain good relations with our immediate neighbours. These incidents do actually cause a lot of additional work for staff at the school - time which would be better spent on school related matters which benefit the children.
