Behaviour

Our revised values of being reflective, aspiring, inquisitive, resilient and working with others are also aimed to create improved behaviour for learning.

We do not use the term 'naughty' in school as this tends to label a child. Instead we talk about what is acceptable and unacceptable/ appropriate and inappropriate behaviour. This is to help children understand that behaviours can cause reactions and to be aware of how their behaviour may affect their learning and wellbeing and that of others.

We would like it if you could support us in this by not using the phrase 'naughty child' and refer instead to behaviours exhibited. All behaviour is a form of communication and it is important that children learn this and know how to deal with it, whether it is happening to themselves or those around them. We want to equip them with the skills to deal with this, not just at school, but as they move through life.

If you have any concerns regarding your child's behaviour please arrange to meet with the class teacher after school or at a mutually convenient time. It is best to have these discussions in a quiet space where you cannot be disturbed. We want to work together with you.

Message from Cllr John Denis

The new government has approved spending £75 Million on improvements to the A27 between Lewes and Polegate. Unfortunately, they have not prioritised giving us a safe means of crossing the A27 between Glynde and Firle.

A safe crossing would make it easier for children from Glynde and homes to the North of the A27 to get to school in Firle under their own steam by walking or cycling, reducing local traffic. It would also make it easier for train users to get to Glynde Station from Firle and villages south of the A27. Visitors to the South Downs arriving by rail would also be more able to safely cross the A27.
