SCHOOL UNIFORM

We have noticed some variations coming into school recently and ask that you ensure that your child/ren follows the school uniform policy. This is-

Green cardigan or school sweatshirt with logo

White polo shirt or shirt (with which school tie may be worn)

Smart dark grey/black school trousers, skirt or shorts (no jean type trousers)

Green gingham summer dresses from April to October

Plain socks/tights in white/green/grey/black

All black shoes (no trainers, crocs or open toed sandals), flat heeled black boots may be worn between October and March. (We appreciate that some children have grown out of their school shoes so please try to replace or find some alternatives that are as close to possible) Hair to be tied back at all times Make-up and jewellery are not allowed apart from simple stud earrings (no nail varnish)


CAR WASH
