Dear Parents and Carers.



The children are really enjoying their new topics and I have seen some lovely work going up in classrooms.

Regarding the Coronavirus news, we understand that we are in a rather unsettling time and we will keep you posted regarding advice from Public Health England and East Sussex County Council. At present East Sussex have said that their advice is for children to continue to come to school as normal. They have stated that they have no confirmed cases in East Sussex and any absence will be unauthorised unless based on medical evidence that would have to be confirmed through written support from the doctor. They have also said that the school is not obliged to provide work as the child is being withdrawn at the parents request, however this would not be the case if the school are in receipt of the medical evidence/ certificate. If a child were to miss 10 sessions (5 days) there is a possibility they could receive a fixed penalty notice and fine, if medical advice was not evidenced. The fine is currently £60 per child per parent.

This advice may change in the next few weeks and we are currently looking at procedures to support children's learning should the government make a decision to close schools.

We will update you with any information via email and through the school website.



STEAM WEEK


