The gift boxes will be aimed at different age categories for children, but we would also like to make some up for adults as well, and to make as many as possible.

We are also in need of some good quality empty shoe boxes to fill. We will put together a list of suggested items next week.

We ask that you only donate if you are in a position to do so. Items should be new and unopened, with a good shelf life of at least a few weeks.
