We are also delighted with our end of key stage results, please see report below.



COULD YOU BE A GOVERNOR FOR OUR SCHOOL?

As a federation, our governing board is responsible for both Firle and Laughton Primary Schools. We want to ensure there is equal representation from both schools on the board and are looking for someone from Firle to join us. School governors take part in deciding what the school priorities are and help support the school leadership in reaching their goals. The role does require commitment but the return is knowing you are helping to make things work and supporting our school to improve. You don't need to be an expert in education or have a teaching background. You need a willingness to use your skills to work with the other governors to support and develop the federation and as such, our children. We need a governor that is able to balance different views and be collaborative when making decisions. Training is provided and new governors are given a mentor. There are a number of different roles we are required to fill on our governing board. I currently hold the role of parent governor for Firle and we need to fill a vacancy for the role of co-opted governor, which can be a parent or carer. A parent governor is voted in by parents and carers and a co-opted governor is 'co-opted' by the governors without election.
