# SECRET GARDEN VISIT

Following on from our topic last term, 'The Secret Garden', we will be taking the children for a picnic to a Secret Garden at Firle Place, next week. The children will leave school at 11:30am and eat their lunch in a beautiful walled garden before returning to school at 12:30p.m.

KS2 children (Beech and Holly classes) will be going on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> June and the infant children (Cherry Class) will be going on Thursday 17th June. The two junior classes will be kept in 2 separate bubbles for the duration of the picnic and we have identified two separate seating areas for the children.

On the day of the picnic for your child/ren, please either send them into school with a packed lunch, or email the office to order a school packed lunch, (either cheese or ham). These need to be ordered by the end of Friday 11th June 2021 so the kitchen can place the correct order for stock.

Before walking to the garden, children will wash their hands and staff will take hand sanitiser with them to use before food is consumed. Children will then wash their hands on the return to school.

# SCHOOL UNIFORM

We have noticed some variations coming into school recently and ask that you ensure that your child/ren follows the school uniform policy. This is-

Green cardigan or school sweatshirt with logo

White polo shirt or shirt (with which school tie may be worn)

Smart dark grey/black school trousers, skirt or shorts (no jean type trousers)

Green gingham summer dresses from April to October

Plain socks/tights in white/green/grey/black

All black shoes (no trainers, crocs or open toed sandals), flat heeled black boots may be worn between October and March. (We appreciate that some children have grown out of their school shoes so please try to replace or find some alternatives that are as close to possible)

Hair to be tied back at all times

Make-up and jewellery are not allowed apart from simple stud earrings and watches (no nail varnish)

Next academic year we will run a uniform draw 3 times a year where children who are wearing the correct school uniform have their names put into a hat. One child is then picked from each class and wins a £3 WH Smith voucher. The children don't know when the draw will take place, so need to be consistent in wearing their uniform. Don't forget that second hand uniform is available from Friends of Firle School.

# PE KITS

Please can you make sure that your child has a PE kit in school every day, with pumps or trainers. # MINI MOVIES




