At Oak Tree Federation, we believe in nurturing well-rounded individuals who are prepared for the challenges and opportunities life may present. Our Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education program plays a pivotal role in shaping the holistic development of our pupils, equipping them with essential life skills and values necessary for success and happiness.

<u>Implementation</u>

The PSHE Curriculum Progression Map is planned using the PSHE Association guidance, but provides flexibility so that learning is personal and appropriate to the needs of our children. Our curriculum is progressive where throughout their school journey, pupils explore the 3 core themes of Health and Wellbeing; Relationships; and Living in the Wider World, allowing for the gradual acquisition of knowledge, values, and skills. This approach ensures a continuous building upon prior learning.

From September 2020, all primary schools are legally required to teach Relationships Education. Our curriculum provides opportunities for children to discuss sensitive topics in a safe space. The PSHE program is designed to align with the school's dedication to safeguarding pupils. It provides an age-appropriate curriculum that equips pupils with the necessary tools to navigate and live safely in the modern world.

We believe that our PSHE education provides crucial life skills for the development and well-being of children and it is integrated into our curriculum on a weekly basis through dedicated lessons to ensure each PSHE theme is explored in depth. Additionally, the staff at Oak Tree Federation have the flexibility to address PSHE spontaneously when issues arise within their own classes and the school environment, ensuring that our curriculum is responsive to the unique needs and development of each child.

PSHE is central to our whole school approach. In our school assemblies, PSHE holds a significant role as we delve deeper into each core value. Here, children actively learn,

question, and apply these values to their own lives. Children's thoughts on each assembly are captured in our assembly reflections journal. Pupils voice is parament to our PSHE curriculum and school life. Both schools have a school council where the council has a representative from every class from year 1 through to year 6.

PSHE plays a pivotal role in our Behaviour Policy, embodying a holistic, school-wide approach driven by Therapeutic Thinking principles. The integration of 'The Colour Monsters' across our school serves as an effective strategy, supporting children in comprehending, managing, and expressing their emotions while fostering a culture of support and empathy among peers.

Impact

Our PSHE curriculum fosters a positive impact on our pupils in numerous ways:

- 1. Preparedness for Life: Through PSHE, our pupils develop crucial life skills such as critical thinking, problem-solving, decision-making, and effective communication.
