
# Newsletter - Term 6 13th June 2019

In England, nymphal tick activity increases during spring, peaking during April to June. This year, south-eastern areas of England are seeing "very high" populations of **ticks**, which can cause fatigue and spread Lyme disease. With this in mind, children going to Forest School must wear long trousers and long sleeved tops, to reduce the direct exposure of ticks to bare skin.
